



In early April we completed the last of our celebrations with our "Stay & Play" event over the eclipse weekend. Those Lions, who took the opportunity to actually stay on campus, finally got to see first-hand how awesome it is for our campers to spend a week here. All the meals were great (thank you Council Chair Ryan & Santa John from Amarillo, and chief bottle washers, Lions John Eads and Joe Kyle), the catfish were huge (15-20 pounders all day long not a fish tale), and the eclipse was fantastic, even though a bit obscured by the clouds. Best of all we were treated to some great music by 5 awesome bands at our music festival across the highway from camp. But our headliner Eric Paslay, a grammy nominated singer & songwriter from Nashville, blew us away with his performance & deserves a little more press:






KILLEEN NOON
